# Reception

# Year 1

Children in Owl class enjoyed exploring the RE Fair and finding out about different cultures and religions.









Owl class learnt about Hinduism. They found out about the meaning of some Hindu symbols and learnt about the Hindu Gods. The children enjoyed learning about Hindu temples (Mandirs) and Hindu family worship. They listened to the story of Rama and Sita and found out about the Hindu festival of light 'Diwali'



Damanjit enjoyed talking about his parents wedding photos and Jai read a Hindu prayer in Hindi.





# Year 2

During our R.E day Year 2 enjoyed learning all about Buddhism. We learnt the story of the Buddha, had a go at meditating/quiet

reflection time if the children wanted to join in and also a show and tell of some objects relating to Buddhism or a religious event.













# Year 3

In Year 3, Mrs Jhajj visited our class to talk about Sikhism and Hinduism. She had photos and artefacts to show us. We also tried some samosas which she brought in. Some of us



found them a little bit spicy! Next, we went to the hall to look around the RE fair. There were hot cross buns to try, books to

look at and artefacts to explore.

Once we had discovered all about the different religions of the world, we went back to class to make information booklets about religions of the world.

After lunch, we shared the items we had brought in with the rest of the class. Some of us brought in family heirlooms, our first bibles,

precious gifts that we were given as children,





photos of our christenings and someone even brought in

their book that they are filling in as preparation for their first holy communion. A great day was had by all!







## Year 4

In year 4 on Monday we learnt about what it was like to be Catholic. We researched and found out about the Rosary beads. We found



out that there is a pattern to the beads that help the owner when praying.

Some of the children, in groups made their own Rosary beads, they used pipe cleaners and beads

to replicate a real set of rosary beads.

We also shared lots of items that the children bought in from home that were special to them. The children enjoyed learning about others traditions and provoked lots of fantastic discussions.









## Year 5



Year 5 'Dove Class' started by learning about the symbolism of the dove within Christianity and the importance that this has across

different religions.

We made doves and then wrote about what they mean to us.



We read the Sikh story of Guru Nanak, Mardana the bowl and the jasmine flower. We then made our own clay bowls.

We have been discovering the roots of Sikhism and how Sikhs' worship today. We looked at the importance of the Gurdwara, the Sikh place of worship. Sikhs not only use the Gurdwara for prayer, but also to eat together. This is known as Langar. Food is cooked and shared by everyone at the Gurdwara. Sikhs often take Langar and help feed those who are homeless and in need of a meal. Sikhs believe that everyone is equal and should be able to eat together. The children had a great time making Langar and an even better time eating it!











Year 6 visited our RE fair and learnt new facts from different religions including trying on clothing.



Year 6 'Eagle class' brought in personal items representing their own religions and shared information with their peers about the religious ceremonies.





In class, we had an in-depth debate on whether justice or freedom was the most important. Even now, our views on this keep changing, but it was definitely a day to open our minds!
