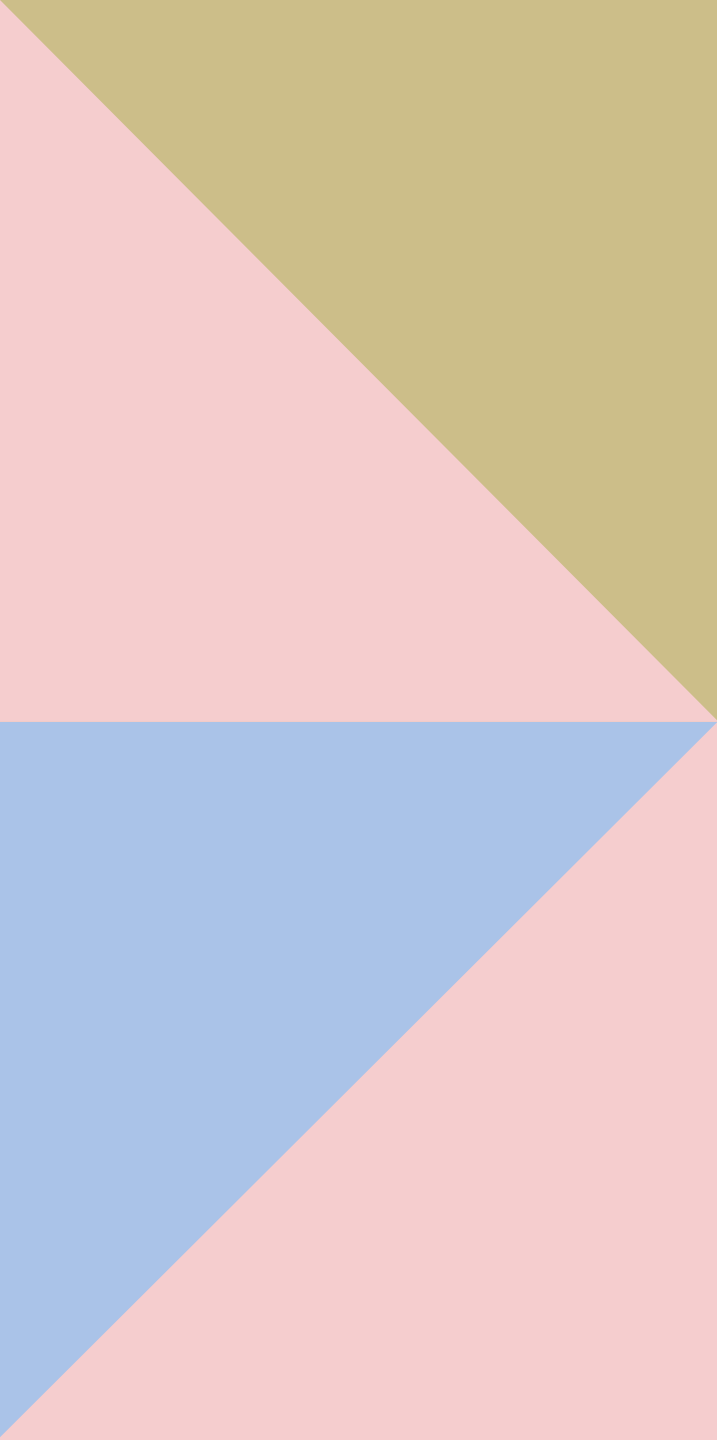

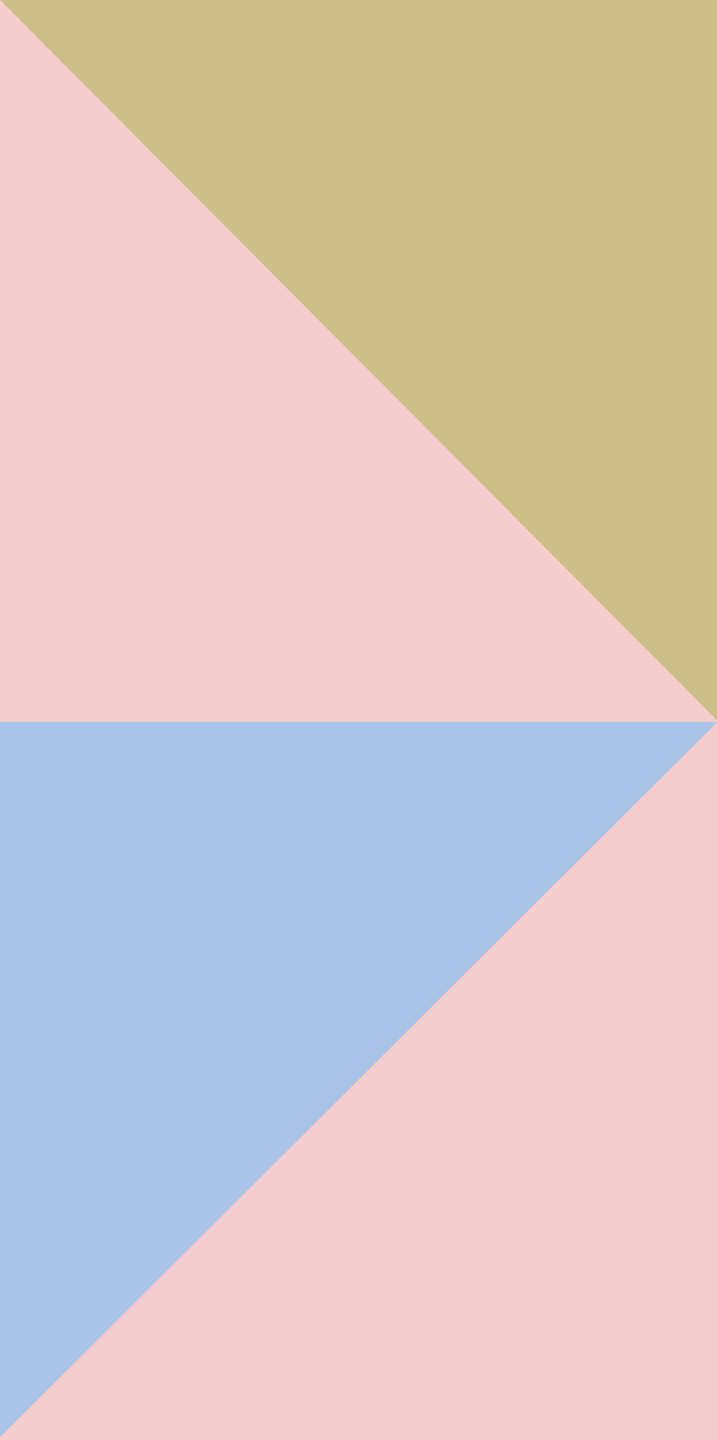
EARLY YEARS CURRICULUM

- Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum
- Areas of Learning
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Communication and Language
- Physical Development
- Literacy includes comprehension, word reading and writing
- Maths including number and numerical patterns
- Understanding The World
- Expressive Arts and Design

- These areas are fundamental to success in Year 1

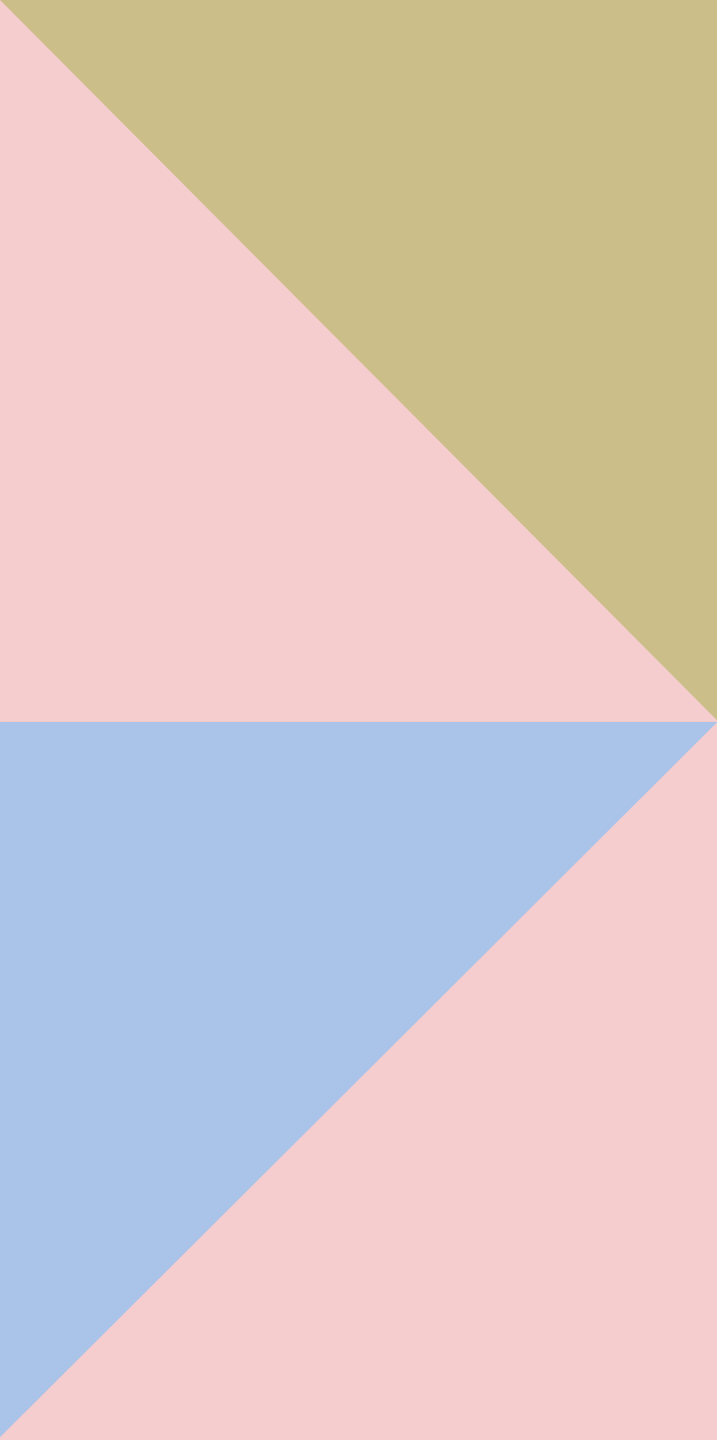
READING

- At this stage, the children will have a pre reading skills book, a book without words to describe the events, characters, settings and make inference to other books and their own experiences alongside sound cards from set 1 sounds
- Our reading and phonics scheme is
- Read, Write Inc. There are 4 class phonics lessons a week learning a new sound each day.
- Sound blending books will follow when the children can segment and blend CVC word p-a-n = pan c-a-t =cat using Fred talk Digraphs are introduced th, ch, sh for blending
- These early skills will follow to read short sentences initially when they move through the reading scheme
- Each day the children will encounter red words that cannot be sounded out phonetically the, I, go, no, said, me, my, do
- I will send home log in details for Reading Eggs to access online books to read at home.



HOW YOU CAN HELP AT HOME

- Share the book 2-3 times, repetition is essential to become a good reader
- Look at environmental print – signs, displays, magazines to read
- Encourage children to write at home, letters, on post it notes, lists for shopping
- Use real coins and look at the value for early addition and subtraction skills
- Counting objects in sets to 10 and go back to check
- Encourage conversation to ensure that the children are hearing sounds in words clearly for early spelling



HOW CAN YOU HELP AT HOME

- Help children to address their own toileting needs
- Help them to learn to do zips and buttons on their clothes, putting on coats
- Using cutlery to cut their food and use it effectively
- Read books from your library and bookshelf
- A brain builder task will be set every half term which can be completed, it is a focus for sharing an activity at home

ASSESSMENT

- In the first six weeks we carry out the statutory baseline assessment that the Dfe has introduced to measure on entry data and the end of key stage two SARs data.
- At the end of the year the children are assessed to whether they have met expected Early Learning Goal or not, this information is provided to you and the Year 1 teacher for a basis to personalise learning at the beginning of Key Stage 1

ASSESSMENT

- We carry out simple assessments in school at the end of Autumn, Spring and Summer Terms
- We will report to parents after Christmas, after Easter and in the summer term
- After Christmas and Easter, this will just be a printout of where your child is in relation to age-related expectations:
 - WTS – working towards the expected standard
 - EXS – working at the age-related expected standard
- In the summer term, this will be a full written report
- Children start a new set of objectives each year, so they won't necessarily be achieving EXS in the autumn – this doesn't mean they aren't on track for achieving EXS in the summer

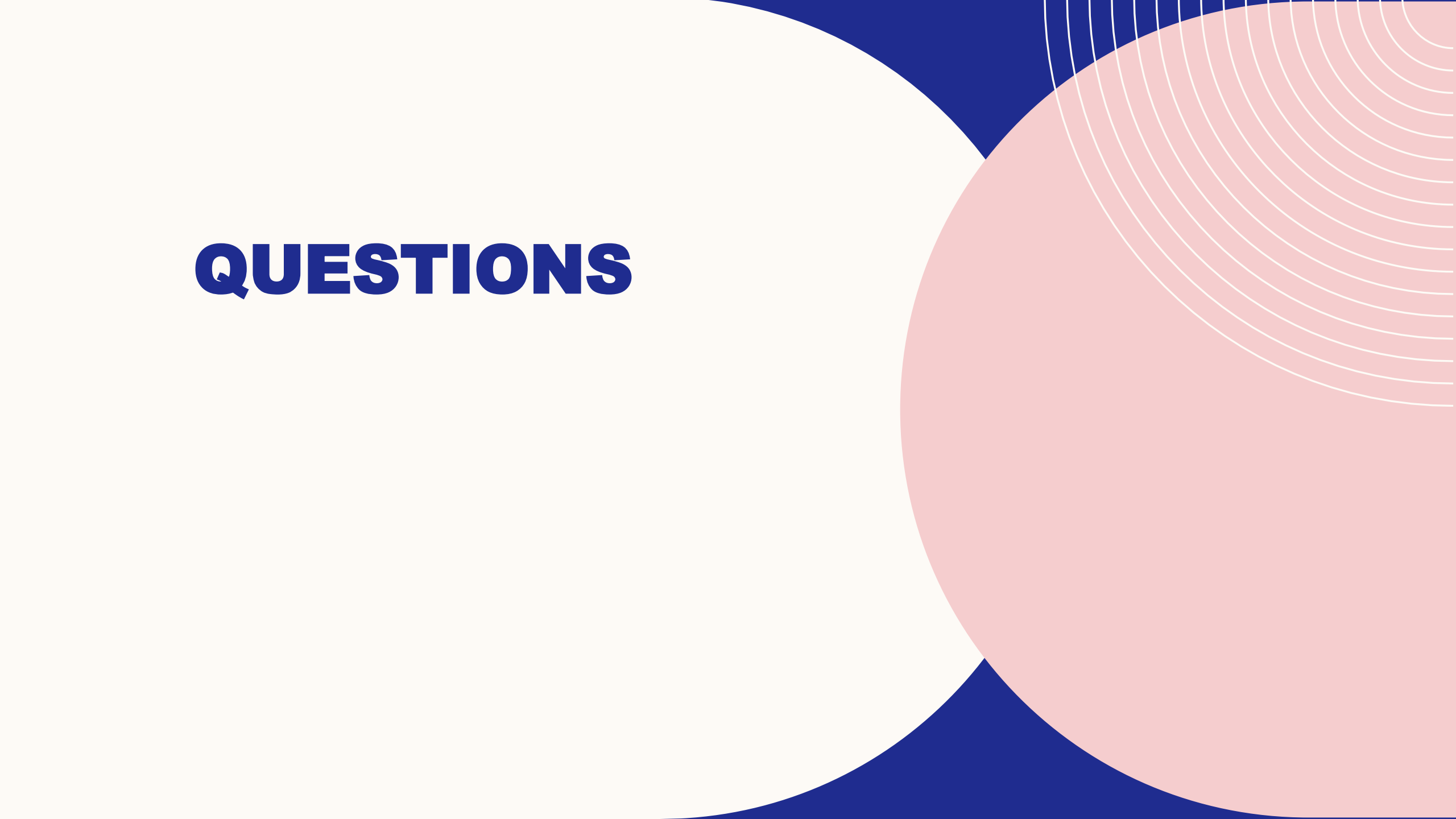
IMPORTANT DATES THIS TERM
