Dear Parents, Carers,

This morning brings a much welcomed respite from the challenges imposed by the cold weather conditions, last week.

A huge 'well done' to all those families who braved the cold and snow on Thursday to attend school. The staff travelled from as far away as Basingstoke to ensure the school stayed open and our working parents, particularly, were not compromised.

Deciding to close the school is always a very difficult call. We study a range of weather forecasts to allow us to give parents and carers as much notice as possible of any disruption to family working routines. I hope the following answers any future queries:

#### SEVERE WEATHER EMERGENCY PLAN

The Head Teacher and Chair of Governors endeavour to keep the school from closure due to severe weather conditions. However, there will be the rare occasion when we will need to make the decision to close. The emergency procedure outlined by RBWM will be followed and parents will be informed via the school website, <a href="https://www.st-michaelsprimary.co.uk/website">www.st-michaelsprimary.co.uk/website</a> and parent mail text messages and email if available.

The school closure will also be reported on the RBWM website www.rbwm.org.uk, local radio stations and the website www.bbc.co.uk/local/berkshire

The school website will be updated regularly with news for parents. Where possible the school will open with a skeleton staff and will offer learning experiences to any pupil who can attend. This will not be the full curriculum entitlement but will enable children to be safe and supervised throughout the school day from 8.40am-3.15pm.

- Teaching and non-teaching staff who are able to travel to school will be asked to support the pupils.
- Pupils will be taught in mixed age groups to ensure they can be adequately supervised. They may be in larger groups than normal if staffing levels are very low.
- Parents who want to keep their children at home will be able to do so and their absence will be authorised whilst the severe weather continues.

• Children who do attend school will be asked to bring a packed lunch in case the catering staff are not able to be on site.

- Emergency contact numbers will be checked as children are dropped at school and where parents have made arrangements to share responsibility with other parents, the school must be informed.
- Children should have warm clothing and strong footwear for the day.
- In the event that the weather conditions deteriorate suddenly during the school day, the Head Teacher will assess the risk and if necessary parents will be contacted and asked to make arrangements for their child to be collected early. This will be to ensure the safety of all pupils and staff on site and travelling to and from school.
- There will not be any after school clubs available when the emergency plans are in operation.
- Staff will not be expected to stay on site beyond 3.30pm.




