Just a couple of quick reminders;

- ✓ All three gates will open at 8.40am and will close at 8.55am.

- ✓ No child is allowed on the Adventure playground for health and safety.

Children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 on Wednesday 16th March and Parents of Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 can pop in on this day to buy afterschool.

- ✓ Easter celebrations at St Michael's Church, will take place on *Wednesday 6th April* after morning registration.
- ✓ **Last day of school,** Friday 8th April 1.30pm.

COVID update

As you may know, whilst the legal requirement for people to self-isolate following a positive test ended yesterday, Thursday 24 February, **the public health advice has not changed**. Adults and children who test positive are **still advised** to stay at home and avoid contact with others for *at least five days*, *up to 10 days*, unless two consecutive negative test results are obtained from day 6 onwards. Please follow the guidance.

The Department for Education also stated this week that, 'If a child has any of the main symptoms or a positive test result, the public health advice remains unchanged and is to stay at home and avoid contact with other people'.

In his announcement, the Prime Minister stated that the country was moving from 'government restrictions to *personal responsibility'*.

As part of that personal responsibility, it is important that **we continue to remain vigilant for Covid-19.** Just as is the case with other viruses, for example norovirus or chicken pox,

those infected should stay at home and follow the guidance until they are clear of the illness. If in doubt, please contact the school. Thank you for your on-going support and cooperation. If your child is unwell, please inform the school office.
