Dear Parents, Carers,

I hope you had an enjoyable half term break and the children feel refreshed and ready to learn; the staff have prepared for an exciting term leading up to Easter. The weather has definitely changed for the better and the delights of spring are just around the corner!

### **Car Parking**

At St Michael's we have always enjoyed a very positive relationship with our neighbours, particularly those on School Road, and we would like this to continue. With this in mind, please park respectfully and be mindful of blocking private driveways or using those business parking areas designated for use by customers only.

Furthermore, please be mindful of the double yellow lines to restrict parking on School Road. This parking restriction serves to allow pupils and families to cross the road safely. We are all aware of the dangers of children crossing the road from behind a parked car! Please help us to keep our children safe at all times.

The public are prohibited from parking on the yellow zig zags outside school at any time. This space is reserved for the use of emergency vehicles in the case of fire or medical emergency. Parents observed using this space could be subject to fines from the local traffic warden.

#### **Attendance**

The governors and staff at St Michael's are committed to taking the school on the next stage of its journey towards being 'Outstanding'. To be an 'Outstanding 'school, inspectors expect to observe and find evidence of an exemplary attitude to learning by the whole school community, including parents. High levels of unauthorised absence do not reflect a positive attitude.

For a child to reach their full educational potential, a high level of school attendance is essential. As a school we strongly discourage **unauthorised absence**.

In the event a child is unwell, there are clear procedures for reporting his/her necessary absence to the school office. No child is expected to attend school if they are ill or need to attend a medical appointment; any such absence will always be marked on the register as 'authorised'. Please refer to the school's attendance policy for reporting a child's absence due to sickness and requesting leave for medical appointments.

School attendance is subject to Education law and this school's **attendance policy** is written to reflect these laws and the guidance produced by the Department for Education (DfE). As a school, together with the Education Welfare





Officer, we review our attendance/absence figures annually and the systems for improving attendance to achieve our set goals. Our target is **98%** attendance.

Please refer to the school's attendance policy or speak to the office if you are unclear about any of the procedures for reporting your child's absence or requesting authorised leave for medical appointments or exceptional circumstances.
