
This week's World War I Class Assembly was performed by Year 6

Join us for a practical "Breathing Space" workshop led by Magdi Kovacs from Special Footprints.

# How would your life be different if you took time to care for yourself?

Always put your oxygen mask on first before helping others." This is a useful reminder of the importance of taking care of yourself as a parent or a carer. Taking time to nurture yourself is not selfish; it is essential.

Finding space and time just for yourself can be virtually impossible at times and it is not difficult to understand why. But, if you don't take care of yourself, you can experience problems such as burnout, stress, fatigue, reduced mental effectiveness, health problems, anxiety, frustration, and difficulty sleeping.

### Breathing Space - how does it work?

This session will help you to step back and reflect on how things could be different and how you might start taking small steps towards positive changes, for example how to find time for you and looking after yourself. Sharing ideas with other parents and carers, discussion is a key part of this session and will be focused around practical, real-life scenarios.

#### The workshop will help you consider:

- How to set meaningful and realistic goals for yourself
- Using practical exercises and tools to manage your time better
- The importance of self-awareness and how to use it in your everyday life
- New tools to help you recognise, manage and reduce your stress levels.

#### Course leader:

Magdi Kovacs was born and raised in Hungary. moved to the UK in 1992 and worked for 15 yea the Conductive Education Centre, working children with special educational needs and families. Magdi now works as a Special Needs Family Life Coach.
