To end our wonderful School celebration everyone was able to enjoy a picnic and a piece of cake!

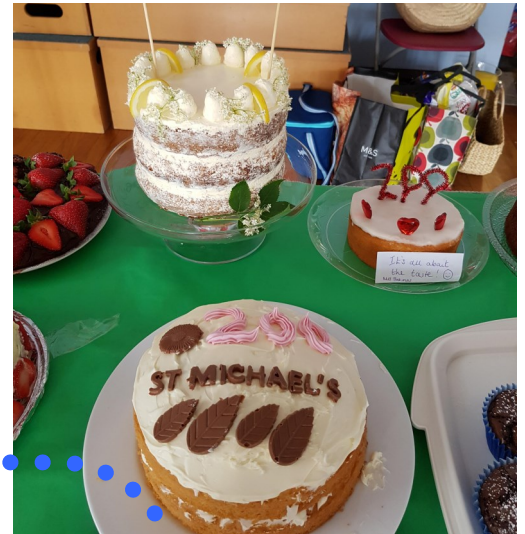




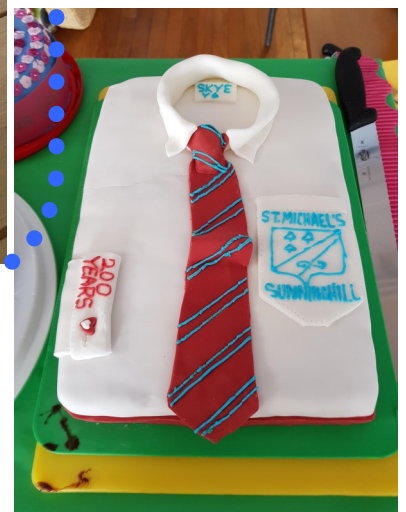
