Roles and Responsibilities in School

I cherish fond memories of my time in Infant School. One of my clearest recollections is being chosen to be 'The Milk Monitor'; this entailed taking responsibility, each day, for making a small hole in the foil top of the milk bottle in readiness for the 'The Straw Monitor', to pop in a straw. The class teacher, allocated various duties each day, but this was my particular favourite. A seemingly small, but nevertheless, important task that allowed me to experience the recognition and appreciation for helping others.

I witness these very same feelings, on a daily basis, with our youngest children as they return the 'Class Box' to the office and take huge pleasure in passing the time of day with the office staff. For those shy children, this is a real achievement.

While many practices in education, over the years, have changed, a timetable for classroom monitors is still recognised and encouraged as being part and parcel of practical classroom management. Taking responsibility for the care of their immediate and whole school learning environment, begins in the Nursery and continues throughout a child's time in school, and can be seen in every classroom up and down the country.

At St Michael's, it is a long standing tradition for children in Year 6 to have a 'Timetable of Duties' and assume whole school responsibilities such as preparing the hall for collective worship or showing prospective parents around the school. I can confidently say that our current Year 6 take their responsibilities seriously. Visitors often comment on their willingness to help, and as such they are a credit to their families and the school.

We are proud of our 'Hidden Curriculum'; specifically, the impact of the 6Rs in preparing our children to make a responsible and valuable contribution as a member of the school community now, and in the future. The recent 'Excellent' SIAMS inspection acknowledged how our vision of 'Learning together through love, friendship, forgiveness and faith' is embedded in the school and evident in how the pupils take ownership and responsibility collectively, for creating a caring and cohesive ethos.

The duties each and every child undertake ensure their school day runs smoothly.

Some parents have questioned the school's practise in allocating duties, with some suggesting this be on a voluntary basis. While some responsibilities assigned to upper key stage 2 can be on a voluntary basis, all pupils at St Michael's are expected to share the class and whole school duties with their peers. For the reasons explained, this practise will continue.




